1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Australian Dental Council ['ADC'] appreciates the invitation of the Dental Board of Australia [the 'Board'] to comment on the Board's proposed registration standard under section 66 of the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act 2009* [the 'National Law'] covering limited registration of dental practitioners for postgraduate training or supervised practice.
- **1.2** The introduction to the consultation draft indicates that the proposed registration standard is to provide an appropriate form of registration for the limited purpose:

for employment in a Public Sector Dental Workforce Scheme, to undertake the Australian Dental Council exam or other exam required by the Board, or to undertake postgraduate studies.

- 1.3 The ADC makes this submission as the external accreditation authority that has been assigned by the Ministerial Council to undertake the accreditation functions for the Dental Board of Australia under the National Law. The accreditation function references in the National Law that are particularly relevant to this registration standard are under s.42:
 - (c) assessing authorities in other countries who conduct examinations for registration in a health profession, or accredit programs of study relevant to registration in a health profession, to decide whether persons who successfully complete the examinations or programs of study conducted or accredited by the authorities have the knowledge, clinical skills and professional attributes necessary to practise the profession in Australia; or
 - (d) overseeing the assessment of the knowledge, clinical skills and professional attributes of overseas qualified health practitioners who are seeking registration in a health profession under this Law and whose qualifications are not approved qualifications for the health profession;

2. Specific Comments on the Proposed Registration Standard

2.1 For ease of reference the ADC comments on the draft Registration Standard are set out in table format in the following pages. Where the ADC is proposing specific changes in wording these are highlighted in both the text of the consultation draft *Standard* and in the ADC suggested wording.

REGISTRATION STANDARD Section 66 – Limited Registration of dental practitioners for postgraduate training or supervised practice	
Authority	
This Registration Standard has been developed by the Dental Board of Australia ('the Board') for consultation under section 38 of the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act 2009 ('National Law').	
Summary	
The Standard sets out the requirements of the Board to register dental practitioners, who are not qualified for general registration, to undertake postgraduate training or supervised practice, under section 66 <i>Limited Registration for postgraduate training or supervised practice</i> ('Limited registration – training /supervised practice') of the National Law.	With the advent of graduate entry programs for professional entry level qualifications there is a need for a definition of 'postgraduate training' in order to avoid confusion or ambiguity. It is suggested that the term as used in this standard have the meaning: 'post-initial education or training'.
The Standard sets out both the initial and ongoing requirements of Limited registration – training/supervised practice. (Additional requirements for registration under Limited registration – training/supervised practice are set out in the relevant Board Guideline for the specific pathway of Limited registration – training /supervised practice.	
The key requirement of Limited registration – training /supervised practice is that the Board must be satisfied that the dental practitioner has completed a qualification that is relevant to and suitable for postgraduate training or supervised practice. In addition, there are requirements for the specific pathways for registration under Limited registration – training /supervised practice, which are set out below.	
Scope of application	
This standard applies to overseas trained dental practitioners who are applying for limited registration to undertake postgraduate training or supervised practice under section 66 of the National Law or for renewal of limited registration for postgraduate training or supervised practice under Part 7 Division 9 of the National Law.

The pathways for Limited registration – training /supervised practice and specific requirements are: Pathway A - Supervised Practice – Practising <u>only</u> under supervision and <u>either</u> :	
1. an employment relationship with an appropriate public sector program; or	
 enrolment in the Australian Dental Council (ADC) final clinical exam and/or in a clinical training or assessment program in preparation for an ADC exam or in another examination required by the Board for registration under section 53(c) of the National Law. And 'an ADC exam' be replaced with: 'an ADC clinical examination'.

Requirements	
The requirements of the Board for registration in Limited registration – training /supervised practice are:	
 Compliance with the requirements of section 65 of the National Law – Eligibility for Limited registration. 	Many relevant overseas qualifications are from graduate entry programs. To avoid confusion or ambiguity, change (2) to read:

Notation on the Register of Dental Practitioners	
Registration in Limited registration – training /supervised practice is granted for a particular purpose and for a limited time. The terms of the Limited registration will be notated on the Register of Dental Practitioners and any practice outside those terms is not permitted .

Board's ability to cancel or refuse to Renew the Limited Registration – Training / Supervised Practice	
The Board may cancel or refuse to renew the Limited registration – training /supervised practice for any of the following:	
 a) the registrant's employment or enrolment in the postgraduate program of study ceases or is terminated 	
b) the registrant fails to comply with supervision requirements	
c) supervision reports have not been provided to the Board at the required intervals	
d) the registrant cannot demonstrate compliance with any terms, conditions or requirements on the Limited registration – training /supervised practice	
e) there is demonstrated unsatisfactory performance in the <i>appropriate public sector program</i> employment position	
f) the registrant has not met any other requirements of the National Law.

Definitions	
ADC approved list - the list approved and published on the Australian Dental Council website at: <u>http://www.adc.org.au</u> which includes listed undergraduate dental programs in Canada, Hong Kong, Ireland, Malaysia, Singapore, South Africa, United Kingdom and the United States.	This ADC Approved List is a list of institutions that are accredited by accrediting authorities in overseas countries that are recognised by the ADC. The ADC periodically reviews the list for currency of entries, so the list may change over time. The list might also change as accreditation and examining authorities in other countries are assessed and recognised pursuant to s42(c) of the National Law. It is therefore suggested that to ensure the accuracy and currency of the standard this definition should not list particular countries and should be changed to read as follows: ADC approved list - the list of institutions in overseas countries that is approved by the Australian Dental Council and published on the ADC website at: <u>http://www.adc.org.au</u> .
ADC exam – This captures both the preliminary (written) and final (clinical) examinations provided by the Australian Dental Council for registration for practitioners with overseas qualifications as set out on its website at: http://www.adc.org.au	See comments above re the ADC preliminary and clinical examinations. It is suggested that this definition should be changed to read as follows: ADC examinations pathway – This term denotes the process conducted by the Australian Dental Council for the assessment and examination for registration purposes in Australia of practitioners with overseas qualifications. It includes both written and clinical examinations, as described on its website at: <u>http://www.adc.org.au</u>
ADC final clinical exam – This is the exam provided by the Australian Dental Council for registration for practitioners with overseas qualifications as set out on its website at: http://www.adc.org.au/. The general objective of the ADC Final Clinical Examination is to evaluate the clinical competence of the candidate in terms of dental knowledge, clinical skills and professional attitudes for the safe and effective clinical practice of dentistry in the Australian community.	See comments above re the ADC preliminary and clinical examinations, and the suggested new terminology and definition of the 'ADC exam'. It is suggested that the terminology and definition for ADC final clinical exam should be changed to read as follows: ADC clinical examination – This is the clinical examination component of the ADC examinations pathway. The general objective of the ADC clinical examination is to assess the clinical competence of the candidate in terms of dental knowledge, clinical skills and professional attitudes for the safe and effective clinical practice of dentistry in the Australian community.

In addition, for dentists with an undergraduate dental qualification from other countries not on the <i>ADC approved list,</i> the public sector employment program must include: a rigorous assessment of the clinical skills and knowledge at the commencement of their employment role; the first three-month period of employment is within a metropolitan public sector facility; and in the first three months of employment, a program covering familiarisation with dental practice in Australia, cultural awareness and skill development, provided by the public sector employer. <i>Approved postgraduate program of study</i> – Is a postgraduate program of study which is published in the Board's <i>Approved Programs of Study</i> list under <i>Qualifications which lead to specialist registration for Dentists</i> and available on the Dental Board of Australia's website at www.dentalboard.gov.au 	 It is suggested that this definition should be reworded as follows: Appropriate public sector program – an employment program which is offered by a State or Territory Health department or a facility directly funded by a State or Territory Health department. In addition, for dentists with a professional entry level dental qualification from other institutions not on the ADC approved list, the public sector employment program must include: a rigorous assessment of the clinical skills and knowledge of the dentist at the commencement of the employment role; the first three-month period of employment is within a metropolitan public sector facility; and in the first three months of employment, a program covering familiarisation with dental practice in Australia, cultural awareness and skill development, provided by the public sector employer.
Applications for variation in changed circumstances If a registrant in the Limited registration – training /supervised practice category has a significant change in circumstances, such as a change in the employment position or post graduate program of study, they must submit a new application for limited registration. However, registrants can apply to the Board for a variation if there is a minor change to their circumstances, such as a change in their supervisor or an extension of the registration period if granted for less than 12 months. Review This Registration Standard will commence on the day it is approved by the Australian Health Workforce Ministerial Council. The Board will review this Registration Standard every three years.
